Faithfulness—Gentleness—Kindness

Faithfulness:

- Guarantees the unchanging nature of God
 - Fidelity required both time and patience
- When we are faithless—He remains faithful
 - II Timothy 2:13

His faithfulness is displayed in His covenant promises, devoted love, and the sureness of His word.

Numbers 23:19

We have an inclination toward faith lessness

- Isaiah 29:13
- We begin to turn aside/go astray when we think something does not matter.....
- What Produces Faithfulness/Endurance

Faith—Trust—Obedience

Gentleness:

- Great strength under control; submission of Jesus to the Father is an illustration.

 Ability to operate with great power yet choosing restraint. Strength works best when harnessed.
- Comes from the Greek word 'praus'=not being over impressed by a sense of ones' own self importance.
- It is a way that Jesus describes Himself.
 - Matthew 11:29
 - Galatians 6:1

He is inviting us into a life of submission—the same way He lived with His Father

- How we demonstrate Him in our dealings with others
 - Ephesians 4:2
 - In Ephesians 6—Fathers are instructed to refrain from harshness toward their children

Kindness:

- Kindness is how God distributes His agape love.
- It is a supernatural fruit of the Spirit in our heart that is able to demonstrate the true nature of God even in the face of wickedness.
- We have all been recipients of the kindness of God
 - Psalm 145:9

The Lord is good to all and His mercies are over all of His works.

Luke 6:35

But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He Himself is kind to ungrateful and evil men.

- We reflect this by loving our enemies
- Kindness is what transforms our hearts—leads to repentance
 - Romans 2:4
